CLIMATE ORGANIZATIONS URGE MARCOS TO HALT KALIWA DAM PROJECT ACTIVITIES PENDING CONCLUSION OF UNBIASED EXPERT INQUIRY

(MANILA, PHILIPPINES) - The Philippines government should order an immediate suspension of all activities related to the Kaliwa Dam Project until an independent expert investigation is completed, Climate Rights International and the Manila Observatory said in an October 16 letter to President Marcos. The organizations also urged President Marcos to commit to implementing the recommendations arising from the investigation.

Climate Rights International (CRI) is a global non-governmental organization dedicated to protecting human rights and addressing climate change, and the Manila Observatory (MO) is an owned research institute focused on climate change adaptation and disaster risk management. CRI and MO commended President Marcos's commitment to prioritize environmental concerns and the country's resilience in the face of climate change. They also appreciated the acknowledgment of the invaluable role played by Indigenous Cultural Communities and Indigenous Peoples in preserving the

Philippines' rich cultural heritage.

However, after conducting field research and consulting local residents and experts, CRI and MO have identified serious concerns related to the Kaliwa Dam Project. These concerns encompass both the environment and the human rights of the Indigenous Peoples within the project area.

Key concerns include:

1. Human Rights Concerns:
 - Livelihoods: The construction of the dam is expected to have severe economic repercussions on the Dumagat-Remontado Indigenous People and local communities who depend on agriculture and tourism.
 - Compensation: Alleged irregularities in compensation distribution have raised questions about the application of the Indigenous Peoples' Rights Act (IPRA).
 - Free, Prior, and Informed Consent Process (FPIC): Accusations of insufficient consultation and flawed FPIC processes have been made by local residents and NGOs.
2. Cultural Rights:

- The dam's construction threatens the cultural and spiritual heritage of the Indigenous Peoples, particularly due to the loss of the sacred Tinipak River.

3. Climate Change and Environment Concerns:

- Deforestation: The construction of the Kaliwa Dam within a forest reserve could lead to increased deforestation and damage to the Sierra Madre's unique ecosystem.
- Increased Risks: The project may exacerbate typhoon-related risks, flooding, landslides, and erosion in the region.
- Harm to Ecosystems and Biodiversity: The dam project's environmental impact could negatively affect the Sierra Madre's diverse fauna and flora.

The Philippines, as a party to a variety of international human rights conventions and the Paris Agreement, has international obligations to ensure that its climate actions respect and protect human rights. The Philippines must respect the rights of Indigenous Peoples, as emphasized by ILO Convention 169 and the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

In closing, CRI and

MO stress the importance of making the Kaliwa Dam Project a model of environmental and human rights

improvement that can inspire future efforts in the fight against climate change. (Manila Observatory)

Groups stage indignation vs. Israeli ground invasion of Gaza

QUEZON CITY, PHILIPPINES - Sanlakas along with member and allied organizations Bukluran ng Manggagawang Pilipino (BMP) and Partido Lakas ng Masa (PLM) will stage an indignation rally against the planned Israeli ground invasion of Gaza. The United Nations had warned of catastrophe in Gaza as Israel prepares for its military offensive. Sanlakas is calling for the stopping of US-Israeli sanctioned genocide of the Palestinians and the end to the Israeli occupation of Palestine.

The action will be staged on Oct. 25, 2023, 9:30AM at Welcome Rotonda, Manila.

To recall, on Oct 7, Hamas launched a coordinated strike against Israeli com-

munities killing an estimated 1,400 civilians and Israeli forces. In the aftermath, for two weeks, the Israeli Government pursued air raids and bombardment over Palestinian settlements in the Gaza Strip including a hospital facility in the area. To date, more than 4,000 Palestinians have been killed by the Israeli Government. More than 2.3 million Palestinians are now growing hungry as they remain blockaded in the Gaza strip. The Gaza strip remains under blockade by the Israeli Government for 17 years now.

Sanlakas stands in solidarity with the Palestinian people in their struggle against the continued illegal Israeli occupation.

CLIMATE WALKERS FROM MANILA EN ROUTE TO TACLOBAN STOP IN ALBAY

ALBAY — Climate activists who have joined the Climate Walk 2023 have arrived in Albay as part of their 30-day climate walk in commemoration of the upcoming 10th anniversary of Typhoon Yolanda.

Two hundred individuals from the local government of Albay and civil society organizations welcomed the group at Daraga Park.

This was followed by a program that recognized the noble efforts of the climate walkers in upholding climate justice amid all the challenges facing the country, which could lead to another Yolanda, or worse.

Larry Pascua, the Senior Energy Program

Officer of the Philippine Movement for Climate Justice (PMCJ), said, "We are about to commemorate the tenth anniversary of Yolanda, yet the national government has remained silent in addressing the pressing challenges of extreme weather conditions brought about by climate change."

He added, "We do not want another Yolanda, so the national government must use its power and resources to address it. Declare a Climate Emergency now!"

The declaration of a Climate Emergency has been the resounding call of PMCJ and its member organizations since the IPCC released the Special Report on 1.5°C.

Yolanda claimed thousands of lives and properties. Ten years have passed, and there are reparations yet to be paid and lives yet to be rebuilt. The Climate Walk for Climate Justice is a strong symbol

that shows that this is what Filipinos need now because there is no time to lose.


DIGITAL LITERACY TRAINING PARA SA MGA PWD, HANDOG NG PAMAHALAANG LUNGSOD


